Building a Strong Foundation

In September 2025, **Team Access was officially recognized by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.** This milestone positioned Team Access to grow sustainably, deepen partnerships, and expand access to inclusive community sport nationwide.

Early Donor Impact

By November 2025, **Team Access successfully raised nearly \$87,000**, directly supporting our flagship participation in El Tour de Tucson. Donor support helped remove barriers, provide logistical support, and welcome more adaptive athletes and community riders than ever before.

Expanding Access at El Tour de Tucson

Thanks to our donors and partners, Team Access expanded inclusive participation by **welcoming 40 Wounded Warriors first-time attendees, 10 support staff, and 12 Wounded Warrior Project alumni** to ride alongside Team Access.

Record-Breaking Growth Through Partnership

Strategic partnerships fueled unprecedented growth. Southern Arizona Adaptive Sports (SAAS) brought 77 team members, while founder Howard N. Stewart recruited an additional 15 community riders. In total, **153 riders participated with Team Access** – the largest team in our history.

Team Access athletes delivered standout performances. One Wounded Warrior Project athlete earned recognition as the fastest male rider in the 32-mile ride. **Tracy LaMarche won overall fastest female adaptive cyclist in the 102-mile ride**, finishing under her goal time despite high winds and rain.
